Dear Friend:

As we approach the holy season of Christmas, I want to thank you for all that you've done to support the orphans in Kibale, Uganda. Through your collective efforts with our mission center, the Kibale Uganda Development Union (KUDU), we have made much progress in the past year. We have now completed our first building, which we are calling The Home of the Holy Angels. We have a few steps left to be accomplished before the doors can open, and are hoping to finish those by end of January, to pump clean running water to the facility, and to do so we need electricity.

Our priority as we enter 2010 is to secure steady and recurring sources of funds. To get there, we are approaching foundations and applying for grants, talking with churches about partnership programs, and asking for individual donations as well. We are hoping to increase the number of monthly donors since that helps to provide a more stable and predictable source of funds. Before we open the doors to the orphanage, we must be confident that we will have the funds to keep the doors open. With God's grace and guidance, I am confident we will get there.

If you haven't been to our website recently, please take a look at <http://helpkibale.org>. The site has been updated recently, and includes our new sponsor-a-child program. Under the "sponsor-a-child" tab, you will see pictures of 26 orphans who we hope will soon be living at The Home of the Holy Angels. We have been fortunate to have some of the children sponsored already. With a monthly gift of \$100 – a little over \$3 per day – you can sponsor a child and fund the total cost for food, clothing, housing and education. Would you consider sponsoring a child like Juliet or Edward? You would be making a big difference for these children if you were able to do so.

You can help us to open the doors to the orphanage sooner by spreading the word about our mission in Kibale. Would you help me by sending this email to at least five others who might be interested in helping our orphans? There are many ways for potential donors to help as shown below:

Become a Kibale Friend: (Periodic Donor)

We appreciate all gifts, whether they are periodic or only one-time. Your contributions will help to provide hope for children who have lost so much. No gift is too small.

Kibale Builders will be recognized in The Home of the Holy Angels with a plaque honoring the givers, or other individuals of their choosing (for example, if given in memory of another).
